- 2 Her sister is graduating this Sunday.  
a (Neg) *Her sister is not graduating this Sunday.*  
b (Y/N) *Is her sister graduating this Sunday?*
- 3 Is John going to sign up for the summer class?  
a (Aff) *John is going to sign up for the summer class.*  
b (Neg) *John isn't going to sign up for the summer class.*
- 4 It won't be hot in August.  
a (Aff) *It will be hot in August.*  
b (Y/N) *Will it be hot in August?*
