

Lesson 11 Exercise 1

Write these predictions as negatives and questions.

- 1 They'll have a baby if they move to a bigger house.
 (neg) They won't/will not have a baby if they move to a bigger house.
 (Y/N) Will they have a baby if they move to a bigger house?
- 2 She will be late again.
 (neg) She won't/will not be late again.
 (Y/N) Will she be late again?
- 3 You'll gain weight if you eat too many doughnuts.
 (neg) You won't /will not gain weight if you eat too many doughnuts. (Ha!!)
 (Y/N) Will you gain weight if you eat too many doughnuts?

Write 3 predictions with *will*

Examples

1. José will become a famous designer.
2. Sohwa will marry a very rich man.
3. Tianqi will meet a supermodel, get married, and have 9 talented children.

Lesson 11 Exercise 3

Box the subject, underline "be going to" and put Vb over the main verb. Then write these intentions as instructed.

Example: The students in this class ^{*} are going to ^X ^{Vb} be successful.

- 1 Laura ^{mw} isn't going to ^{Vb} run the marathon.
 (Aff) Laura is going to run the marathon.
 (Y/N) Is Laura going to run the marathon?
- 2 Those cars ^{Vb} are going to crash.
 (Neg) Those cars aren't going to crash.



(Y/N) *Are those cars going to crash?*

3 *They* ^{Vb} *are going to see* a movie tonight.

(Neg) *They aren't going to see a movie tonight.*

(Y/N) *Are they going to see a movie tonight?*

Write 2 intentions with *be going to BASE*

Examples

1. *I'm going to lose 10 pounds this summer. Really.*
2. *John is going to go to Harvard some day.*

Correct these sentences

1. I going California next week. *I am going to California next week.*
2. He is going visit relatives. *He is going to visit relatives.*
3. You are do going to eat now? *Are you going to eat now?*



4. It will be warm this weekend? *Will it be warm this weekend?*
5. It wont rain on her wedding day.
It won't rain on her wedding day. (wont is a different word!)
6. He goes to be a doctor. *He is going to be a doctor.*
7. You gonna to go to shopping?
Are you going to go shopping? Casual spoken English: You gonna go shopping?
8. She gets home at 6:30 and will eat dinner.
She'll get home at 6:30 and (will) eat dinner.
She gets home at 6:30 and eats dinner.

4. I	will go <i>am going</i> am going to go	to a concert tonight.
5. The last day of class	<i>is</i> will be is being is going to be	April 26 th . <i>Yes, it's in the future, but it's a fact.</i>
6.	Are you Will you plan <i>Are you planning</i> Are you going to plan	to go home for the summer?
7. Selyn's birthday	<i>is</i> will be is being is going to be	this Saturday. <i>Yes, it's in the future, but it's a fact.</i>
